Suzanne Frazer, Co-Founder of Beach Environmental Awareness Campaign Hawai'i (B.E.A.C.H.) will talk about the importance of the ocean and the urgent need to take action to protect it. Suzanne Frazer founded B.E.A.C.H. with Dean Otsuki in 2006. They received the Astrid and Donald Monson Community Action Award given for outstanding contributions to protecting Hawai'i's environment and marine life, and the Living Reef Award which honours groups and individuals that go above and beyond in their actions to make a difference in preserving the reefs.
